## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The District 5 HAZMAT Training and Advisory Council in collaboration with the Marion County Emergency Management Agency proudly presents the training of two courses from the Center for Domestic Preparedness.

### **WMD Crime Scene Management**

#### **Course Description**

The WMD Crime Scene Management for Emergency Responders course is an eight-hour course that provides the responder with an overview of the legal issues surrounding a Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, or Explosive (CBRNE) crime scene, the types of evidence at a CBRNE incident, and practical exercises utilizing the responder's knowledge in crime scene management. As part of the eight contact hours for this course, the responder will receive instruction on the laws, regulations, proper guidelines, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)'s Crime Scene Search Protocol process that apply to crime scene management.

Target Audience/Disciplines: Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Emergency Management Agency (EMA), Fire Service, hazardous materials (HAZMAT), public works, governmental administrative, public safety communications, health care, and public health.

Additional Qualifications/Certifications: CSM is designed for any emergency responder currently working in an emergency response discipline.

### **WMD Evidence Collection**

#### **Course Description**

The WMD HAZMAT Evidence Collection Course is a 16-hour course that provides the responder with an overview of information regarding the organization and functions of both the HMRT and the HMRU, and with skills that will enable the responder to assist in collecting and processing materials used as evidence of criminal activity. The course culminates with a scenario-driven practical exercise, during which the responder will be able to demonstrate their knowledge of safe work practices utilized in a potentially hazardous site and demonstrate their knowledge of how to recognize, classify, collect, and document potential evidence.

Target Audience/Disciplines: Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Emergency Management Agency (EMA), Fire Service, hazardous materials (HAZMAT), public works, governmental administrative, public safety communications, health care, and public health.
