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**Hazardous Materials** - Available on a 24/7 basis for removal of these materials.

**Safe Water**- Daily testing of city-provided water. Provide septic tank permits and inspect Septic tanks periodically. Annually inspect public swimming pools.

**Safe Housing**- Inspects complaints of unsafe housing conditions. Works closely with the neighborhood associations.

**Weed and Trash Removal** - Works in conjunction with Safe Housing. Are able to cite offenders, giving deadlines for correction.

**Food Safety** - Any establishment that provides food must have a permit. Annual inspections conducted.

**Tattoo Parlors** - These must have permits also and they are carefully inspected.

She reported that miscellaneous revenues have increased 62% from 2000 to 2005.

Ms. Womacks noted that there were two properties that an individual had purchased at a tax sale that has Health and Hospital land between the properties that needs taken care of through the Treasurer's office. Ms. O'Laughlin gave details of who to call to take care of this.

Mr. Rodman thanked Ms. O'Laughlin and Ms. Journey for their report.

Ms. Womacks made a motion to re-appoint Ms. O'Laughlin to the Health and Hospital Board for another four years. Ms. Sharpe seconded. Motion passed.

Response to Public Hearing: There was no public hearing.

Old Business: Ms. Womacks reported that the Professional Service Agreement and Purchase Order had been obtained and Ms. Ray has been paid for March and April. Ms. Harris indicated that two appeal hearing cases had been sent to the Circuit court.
